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OFFICE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL:

Councilman Verile The Recreation Easter Egg Hunt this year was the largest one yet. All of the money is saved up for the Cultural Arts summer concerts.

Councilwoman Tedesco-Santos The flyer for the Pool was sent out. Registration started on April 18. Interviews for Lifeguards and Clerks have been conducted. The Fire Department has responded to 63 calls since the last report. The officers have been trained on new equipment. The Library renovations have not started yet. The Reid Library hours have been extended.

Councilwoman Bellinger The budget is being introduced. There is another zero percent increase this year. We are expanding the Senior Center and the IT Department and still maintaining zero increase as well as Triple A Bond rating. There will be a public information session put together to go over all the information regarding the Master Plan. There will be a public notice sent out as well as a fact sheet and all documents will be made available in public places.

Councilwoman Weber The Historic Committee would like to know if the plans for 113 West Midland Avenue have been discussed regarding subdivision. April is Oral Cancer Awareness Month. There are some spots left for residents to become certified in Mental Health First Aid. The free rabies clinic will be held in May for dogs and cats. The Board of Health will hold a special hearing for Just Pups, Inc. on May 2, 2016 where they will decide on revoking there license. On May 25, 2016 the Board of Health will be taking Just Pups, Inc. to municipal court. A total of 403 summonses have been issued.

Councilman Garcia Earth Day is April 24, 2016. The Farmers Market will return starting June 15, 2016. The Golf Course had its best March ever due to good weather.

Mayor LaBarbiera Tonight we welcomed six police officers. There are many good things happening in Paramus. We cannot diminish the significance of a zero percent tax increase. We have worked diligently over the past years. There are not many communities in such solid fiscal position. There are only 17 communities in the entire state that have a Triple A Bond rating. Paramus continues to grow and the future is bright as we revise our Master Plan.


WHEREAS, the New Jersey Legislature has adopted Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, known as "The Open Public Meetings Act"; and

**ORDINANCE CREATING STIPEND PROGRAM FOR OFFICE OF EMERGENCY
MANAGEMENT**

Section 1. Purpose & Authority. The purpose of this ordinance is to create a stipend program for the Paramus Office of Emergency Management.

Section 2. Stipend Program. The following provisions shall be codified in the Paramus Code:

Stipend Program.

Any member of the Paramus Office of Emergency Management (hereinafter referred to as O.E.M.) who shall respond to 40% of town wide emergencies, to include, but not limited to, fires, floods, snow emergencies, lost persons, active shooter or any other activity deemed a town emergency to which he/she is assigned or attends during any one calendar month shall be entitled to an allowance fixed by the Mayor and Council, in the amount \$500 per month or in accordance with any effective changes to the Paramus Volunteer Fire Department stipend program. To be eligible to receive the monthly allowance each member will receive credit for drills at the Life Safety Complex or any other sanctioned day and/or night exercises or meetings. Additionally, members must attend a minimum of five (5) monthly training sessions with O.E.M. Should any member be unavailable to attend a monthly training session due to a conflict with their work schedule they will be afforded the opportunity to attend a make-up session to be arranged with the O.E.M. Coordinator and/or any one of the Deputy Coordinators. Any O.E.M. member attending an approved training class, whether at the Bergen County O.E.M. training center in Mahwah, or any other official training center, in or out of county, will be afforded credit for the monthly training requirement in the month they attend the classes. Advanced permission from the Coordinator and/or any one of the Deputy Coordinators will be required for members to receive credit for attending outside training classes. O.E.M. members are also assigned to be "on call" for two (2) calendar weeks per duty assignment three (3) to four (4) times per calendar year, depending on their scheduled rotation. This assignment places the member on 24/7 status during this time period and will, if not excused by the O.E.M. Coordinator and/or any one of the Deputy Coordinators, respond to all emergencies necessitating O.E.M. assistance. Many of the O.E.M. members are also volunteer members of the Paramus Volunteer Fire Department and Paramus Volunteer Rescue Squad. These members are covered by the existing stipend ordinance of the Borough. Therefore, under no circumstances will an existing member of the Paramus Volunteer Fire Department or Paramus Volunteer Rescue Squad receive two (2) stipend disbursements during any given month. The accumulated moneys for each of the three months in each quarter shall be paid to the member at the first pay period for the following month. For example, stipends earned from July 1, 2015 to September 30, 2015, paid on the last Mayor and Council meeting of October, 2015; stipends earned from October 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015, paid on the last Mayor and Council meeting of January, 2016, etc.

Annual review of stipend.

During the month of January of each succeeding year, the Mayor and Council will review the allowance provisions and make any changes it shall deem necessary.

Construal of payments.

The payments set forth above shall constitute reimbursement for various expenses which may be incurred by the volunteer members of the Office of Emergency Management in the faithful performance of their duties and shall not be considered as salary, nor shall such payments be considered to in any way construe the creating of a paid or partially paid Office of Emergency Management within the Borough of Paramus.

Yearly clothing allowance.

There will be no clothing allowance approved at this time. This provision will be reviewed by the Mayor and Council yearly.

Verification of attendance.

The Coordinator of O.E.M. shall institute an authentication procedure for the verification of attendance which shall be approved annually by the governing body. Such procedure shall include, but shall not be limited to, a requirement that each member of O.E.M. personally sign a roster or an approved witnessed absentee roster at the completion of and after each emergency indicating his or her attendance at such emergency, with such signatures to be witnessed by the ranking member in charge. Each member of O.E.M. shall maintain on file a specimen of his/her signature; and the forms utilized in recording the attendance for each call shall be subject to the random and periodic audit under the direction of the Borough Administrator. These verification procedures will affect all members of O.E.M. with the exception of the Coordinator and the deputy coordinators who, by virtue of their position within the O.E.M., will not be subject to the verification of each emergency responded to within the confines of the Borough of Paramus, as many times they are required to remain at an emergency for extended periods of time and the verification procedures presently under consideration would not and could not become applicable. The O.E.M. Coordinator and the deputy coordinators will be responsible to the Borough Administrator to verify their attendance at each emergency if their names do not appear on the attendance roster.

Execution of waivers.

No member of O.E.M. shall be entitled to any payment hereunder until he/she shall first have executed a waiver to be prepared under the direction of the office of the Borough Clerk, waiving any and all claim to pension, civil service or employment status of any kind whatsoever as a result of receiving payment under the provisions of this Part ?.

When effective; expiration; payments.

Shall take effect January 1, 2016 upon passage. Payments shall be calculated and made within the calendar quarter immediately following the preceding quarter as outlined above.

Biannual report by Coordinator.

The Coordinator of O.E.M. shall biannually report the effect of such payments on the membership and attendance and such other information as may be directed by the Mayor and Council regarding the operation of the program on the volunteer O.E.M. as a unit.

Section 3. No New Rights/No Vacancies. Unless expressly stated otherwise or required by law, this ordinance shall not create any rights that did not exist before this ordinance and this ordinance shall not be deemed to create any vacancies unless the law requires otherwise.

Section 4. Repealer. All prior ordinances that are inconsistent with this ordinance are repealed. All ordinances are hereby amended to be consistent with this ordinance and all ordinances, including this one, shall be construed consistent with the express purpose of this ordinance.

Section 5. Savings and Construction. This ordinance shall be construed consistent with the purpose stated in section 1 hereof. Any ambiguities in this ordinance shall be construed



BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE EAST BROOK MIDDLE SCHOOL SYNTHETIC TURF ATHLETIC FIELD PROJECT IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF PARAMUS, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$863,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Paramus, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Paramus, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake the East Brook Middle School Synthetic Turf Athletic Field Project consisting of the installation of a synthetic turf athletic field, site improvements and related amenities in, by and for the Borough. Said improvement shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor. Said project is being undertaken by the Borough and the Paramus Board of Education (the "Board of Education" and lead agency) as a joint recreation project under a shared services agreement between the Borough and the Board of Education. Pursuant to such agreement, the Board of Education and the Borough shall share equally the costs of the project, less any grants received.

Section 2. The sum of \$863,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvement described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. It is anticipated that an \$83,626 grant from the County of Bergen Open Space, Recreation, Floodplain Protection, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund shall be received by the Borough to finance the cost of the improvement described in Section 1 hereof. Said grant funds shall be applied as

set forth in Section 10 hereof. Said improvement shall be made as a general improvement and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefitted.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) said purpose is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the total estimated cost of said purpose is \$863,000, and (4) \$42,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$821,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$35,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$42,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$42,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$821,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by

law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$821,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

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Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of fifteen years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$821,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvement described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the

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Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

DEALERS OF PRECIOUS METALS, GEMS AND SECONDHAND GOODS

Section 1. Purpose and Intent.

The purpose and intent of this section is to assist law enforcement officials and victims of crime in recovering stolen precious materials, gems, gemstones and/or other articles by requiring minimum reporting, maintenance and distribution criteria for secondhand and transient dealers.

No person shall use, exercise or carry on the business, trade or occupation of buying scrap gold, old gold, silver, jewelry, home electronics/audio and visual equipment, musical instruments, telephones and telephonic equipment, scales, computers, computer hardware and software, typewriters, word processors, scanners, sporting goods of all kinds, antiques, platinum, all other precious metals, tools of all kinds, televisions, DVRs, GPS, camcorders, car stereos, gift cards, furniture, clothing or other valuable articles, hereinafter referred to as "secondhand goods or articles," or being a secondhand dealer within the Borough of Paramus without having first obtained a license from the Borough of Paramus.

Section 2. Definitions.

For the purposes of this section, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings ascribed herein. Words used in the present tense shall include the future, words in the plural number shall include the singular number and words in the singular number shall include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

Acceptable identification shall mean acceptable forms of identification which include: a current valid New Jersey Driver's License or Identification Card, a current valid photo driver's license issued by another US state, a valid United States Passport, or other verifiable US government issued identification.

Article shall mean any article of merchandise, including any portion of such article, whether a distinct part thereof or not, including every part thereof whether separable or not, and also including material for manufacture. And as so defined in N.J.S.A. 51:6-1.

Automated Kiosk shall mean an interactive device that is permanently installed within a secure retail space and has technical functions that can remotely monitor the kiosk, verify the seller's identification, and store goods securely.

Chief of Police shall mean the Chief of Police of the Borough of Paramus or his designee/representative.

Database shall mean a computerized interne capable database with hardware and software compliant to that set by the Chief of Police.

Dealer shall mean any person, partnership, corporation, or other entity, whether permanent or itinerant, who on one or more occasions (through any means) buys or sells or otherwise exchanges or trades secondhand gold, silver, precious metals, gems, or jewelry, and includes anyone advertising the purchase or sale of any of the aforementioned items.

Designated vendor shall mean a person or entity that is appointed or designated by the Chief of Police who is authorized to collect and maintain precious metal transaction information, or other purchase information as defined herein, for the Borough of Paramus.

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Gift card shall mean a restricted monetary equivalent or script that is issued by retailers or banks to be used as an alternative to a non-monetary gift.

Itinerant business shall mean any business conducted intermittently within the Borough of Paramus or at varying locations.

Person shall mean any individual natural person, partnership, joint venture, business, society, associate, club, trustee, trust, corporation, or unincorporated group, or an officer, agent, employee, servant, factor or any form of personal representative of any thereof, in any capacity, acting for self or on behalf of another.

Precious metals shall be comprised of gold, silver, platinum and/or their alloys as defined in N.J.S.A. 51:5-1 et seq., N.J.S.A. 51:6-1 et seq., and/or N.J.S.A. 51:6A-1 et seq.; gems, gemstones, coins and all forms of jewelry herein contained.

Public shall mean individuals and retail sellers, not to include wholesale transactions or transactions between other merchants.

Purchase shall mean the exchange of money and the exchange, deposit, pledge, sale, conveyance or trade of any tangible or intangible article.

Reportable transaction shall mean every transaction conducted by a dealer in which precious metals, or other tangible property, are purchased or exchanged from or with the public.

Secondhand goods shall mean any article previously sold, acquired, exchanged, conveyed, traded or otherwise formerly owned, including but not limited to scrap gold, old gold, silver, jewelry, home electronics/audio and visual equipment, telephones and telephonic equipment, scales, computers, computer hardware and software, coins, electronic tablets, cameras, scanners, sporting goods of all kinds, antiques, platinum, all other precious metals, tools of all kinds, televisions, DVRs, GPS, camcorders, car stereos, gift cards, furniture, clothing or other valuable articles.

Transient buyer shall mean a dealer who has not been in any retail business continuously for at least six (6) months at any address in the municipality where the dealer is required to register or who intends to close out or discontinue all retail business in the Borough of Paramus within six (6) months. Or as so defined in N.J.S.A. 51:6A-5 and N.J.A.C. 13:47C-1.1.

ORDINANCE 16-14**

Section 3. Application and Issuance of License.

a. Initial License Application Process.

Every dealer intending on conducting business with the jurisdiction of the Borough of Paramus shall first make application to the Municipal Clerk and shall set forth the name and address of dealer, his or her age, whether or not he or she is a citizen of the United States and whether or not he or she has been convicted of a crime, the place of conviction, and the date thereof.

A dealer of precious metals, gems or gemstones or second hand goods shall, prior to buying, attempting to buy or offering to buy shall be required to be fingerprinted and shall consent to an investigation of the applicant's moral character and business responsibility as deemed necessary, by the Paramus Police Department for the protection of the public welfare. In the event that the dealer is a business entity other than a sole proprietorship, the officers in a corporation or the partners in a partnership, or limited partnership, shall be deemed to be the applicant(s) who shall be fingerprinted and investigated in accordance with this section.

Upon initial application to the Municipal Clerk, each dealer shall be provided with an application prescribed by the Paramus Police Department and shall provide the following information on said application:

1. Name and address of dealer;
2. Address from which dealer shall conduct business;
3. Copy of valid zoning and/or construction permits from the Borough of Paramus;
4. Proof that dealer has obtained computer equipment and software required in section 6 of this Ordinance, for purposes of reporting all transaction data in electronic format to the Paramus Police Department.

b. Contingency. Upon completion of the investigation, the Chief of Police shall either approve or deny the license based upon the results of the Paramus Police Department investigation. No license shall be issued without the approval of the Chief of Police or his or her designee.

c. Renewal

All renewal applications are to be received in the clerk's office no later than January 10th of each year. In the event that the dealer is a business entity other than a sole proprietorship, if the business entity took on a new officer(s) or partner(s) within the preceding year, the new officer(s) / partner(s) shall be deemed to be the applicant(s) who shall be fingerprinted and investigated in accordance with section "a. Initial License Application Process."

In the event a Dealer fails to file a renewal application by January 31" of each year, the applicant will be assessed a fifty (\$50.00) dollar penalty.

In the event a Dealer fails to file a renewal application after January 31' and after receiving notice by the Paramus Police Department and given 10 business days to file such renewal application, the Dealer license may be revoked following the process as outlined in Section 5 of this Ordinance.

Section 4. License Fees; Nontransferability.

a. Each application for a dealer of secondhand goods license shall be accompanied by an annual fee of three hundred (\$300.00) dollars payable to the Municipal Clerk by January 10th annually.

b. A license issued under the provisions of this section shall not be transferable and shall terminate on December 31st of the year in which said license is issued.

c. No license fee shall be pro-rated.

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Section 5. Revocation of License.

a. Licenses issued under the provisions of this section may be revoked by the Chief of Police after a hearing upon notice to the applicant for any of the following causes:

1. Fraud, misrepresentation, or false statement contained in the application for license;
2. Fraud, misrepresentation, or false statement made in the course of carrying on the business of purchasing secondhand precious metals, gems, and jewelry;
3. Any violation of this section;
4. Conviction of any crime or disorderly persons offense involving moral turpitude; and
5. Conducting the business of soliciting or canvassing in an unlawful manner or in such a manner as to constitute a breach of the peace or to constitute a menace to the health, safety, or general welfare of the public.

b. Notice of the hearing for revocation of a license shall be given in writing, setting forth specifically the grounds of complaint and the time and place of hearing. Such notice shall be mailed, postage prepaid, to the licensee at his last known address at least five (5) days prior to the date set for the hearing.

Section 6. Dealers' Responsibilities, Requirements and Record Keeping.

Every dealer within the Borough of Paramus shall, upon the purchase of any precious metals, or second hand goods from the public, be required to do as follows:

a. Record on a numbered receipt the name, address and telephone number of the purchaser; the name, address and telephone number of the seller or sellers; the time and date of the transaction; the net weight in terms of pounds Troy, pennyweight (Troy) or kilograms/grams of the precious metals; fineness in terms of karats for gold, and sterling or coin for silver, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 51:5-1 et seq., and N.J.S.A. 51:6-1 et seq. This information is to be documented through use of an electronic database software system as designated by the Chief of Police. These records shall be subject to the inspection of any sworn police officer of the State of New Jersey.

b. Through the use of applicably required computer equipment, and using the electronic format approved by the Chief of Police, enter all transaction into the electronic database within twenty four (24) hours from the date of purchase. The information entered will contain the information in subsection 6a. above, plus the following:

1. A physical description of the seller;
2. The receipt number;
3. A full description of the item or items purchased, including but not limited to, marks, numbers, dates, sizes, shapes, initials, monograms and serial numbers.
4. The price paid for the item;
 5. The form must be signed by the seller;
 6. The form must be legibly initialed by the clerk or the dealer who made the transaction so as to readily identify that individual.
7. A color photograph or color image of the seller's presented identification.
8. A color photograph or color image of all items sold. When photographing or imaging all items must be positioned in a manner that makes them readily and easily identifiable.

c. All precious metals, articles and secondhand goods are to be made available for inspection by the

Chief of Police of the Borough of Paramus for a period of fourteen (14) days from the date the information required above is received by the Chief of Police on the approved form. The precious metals shall remain in the same condition as when purchased and shall not be changed, modified, melted or disposed of by the purchaser until the fourteen-day period has expired. During this fourteen day period, the precious metals shall be placed in public view at the purchaser's place of business.

d. In the event a database failure, or dealer's computer equipment malfunction, all transaction information is required to be submitted on paper forms approved by the Chief of Police. In the event that paper forms are used, the dealer is responsible to enter all transaction information into the database as soon as possible upon the dealer's equipment being repaired or replaced, or the database coming back into service. Failure by the dealer to properly maintain computer equipment in a reasonable fashion, or failure by the dealer to replace faulty computer equipment, may result in the dealer being cited for a violation of the ordinance and subsequently being subject to the penalties for doing so.

e. Dealer payment to the sellers in cash shall be limited to two (2) transactions during a seven (7) day period for the same seller. The seven (7) day period will commence on the day of the first transaction and end seven (7) days after the transaction, i.e. if transaction #1 occurs on Monday the seven (7) day period ends on Sunday. Furthermore, no cash payments shall be made to the same sellers who make more than five (5) transactions in any given thirty (30) day period. Sellers making transactions over the number of prescribed weekly and monthly periods will be paid by the dealer by means of a bank check drawn from the dealer's business account.

f. It shall be the requisite duty of every dealer, and of every person in the dealer's employ, to admit to the premises during business hours any sworn police officer of the State of New Jersey to examine any database, book, ledger, or any other record on the premises relating to the purchase of precious metals from the public, as well as the articles purchased or received, and to take possession of any article known by the police officer or official to be missing or to have been stolen, or where the officer or official has probable cause to believe the article is missing or stolen.

Section 7. Nonapplicability.

a. This section shall not apply to purchases made by jewelers or other dealers from wholesalers or other suppliers, but shall only apply to those purchases made from the public or other retail purchases. The dealer shall keep records of all wholesale purchases for a period of 5 years from the date of such purchase, which records shall be opened to investigation by the Paramus Police Department.

b. Section 6 shall not apply to purchases made by automated kiosks. The automated kiosks shall keep records of all purchases for a period of five (5) years from the date of such purchase, which records shall be opened to investigation by the Paramus Police Department. This information is to be documented through the use of an electronic database software system as designated by the Chief of Police. These records shall be subject to the inspection of any sworn police officer of the State of New Jersey. All other sections of this Ordinance shall apply to automated kiosks.

Section 8. Purchases from Minors.

No dealer within the Borough of Paramus shall purchase any precious metals from any person under the age of eighteen (18) years.



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Section 9. Violations and Penalties.

Violation of any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars for a first offense, one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars for a second offense, and three thousand (\$3,000.00) dollars for a third offense or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days or by a period of community service not exceeding ninety (90) days. Each and every violation shall be considered a separate violation. Every day that a violation continues shall be a separate violation. Each violation shall result in an additional ten (10) day suspension. Any person who is convicted of violating the provisions of this Chapter within one year of the date of a previous violation and who was fined for the previous violation may be sentenced by the Court to an additional fine as a repeat offender. The additional fine imposed as a repeat offender shall not be less than the minimum or exceed the maximum fine provided herein, and same shall be calculated separately from the fine imposed for the violation of this section.

ORDINANCE NO. 16-15

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 419 OF THE CODE OF THE
BOROUGH OF PARAMUS ENTITLED VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC TO PROVIDE
FOR THE DESIGNATION OF STOP INTERSECTION.**

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 39:4-8 provides that a municipality may, without the consent or approval of the New Jersey Commissioner of Transportation, adopt an Ordinance regulating traffic in a manner consistent with current standards prescribed by the State Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways provided that said Ordinance regulates a provision contained in N.J.S.A. 39:4-197; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 39:4-197 provides that a municipality may adopt an Ordinance regulating "the passage or stopping of traffic at certain congested street corners or other designated points, including the establishment of multi-way stop controls; and

WHEREAS, said Statutes further require that the Municipal Engineer certify to the governing body of a municipality that any traffic designation or erection of signs has been approved by the engineer after investigation of the circumstances appears to the Engineer to be in the interest of safety and conforms to the current standards prescribed by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer for the Borough of Paramus has provided a Certification and letter to the Borough and to the Chief of Police of the Borough recommending that a multi-way stop control be implemented at the intersection of Lawrence Drive and Lawson Place and confirming that the installation of a multi-way stop control at the designated intersection would comply with all applicable sections of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Paramus find that the installation of a multi-way stop control at the designated intersection will improve traffic safety within the Borough,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Paramus as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 419 Article II Section 419-9 designated Through Streets as follows:

§ 419-9. Through Streets.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VII (§ 419-49), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as through streets. Stop signs shall be installed on the near right side of each street intersecting the through street except where yield signs are provided for in the designations.

Chapter 419 Article VII Section 419-49 designates the Through Streets;

§ 419-49. Schedule VII: Through Streets.

Stop signs shall be installed on the near right side of each street intersecting the through street, except where yield signs are provided for in the designation.

Midland Avenue	From Farview Avenue to Paramus Road except at Route 17
Nugent Street	From Ridgewood Avenue to Glen Avenue

Section 2. Severability.

If the provisions of any article, section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this ordinance shall be judged invalid in whole or in part or as applied to any particular circumstance or individual by a court of competent jurisdiction, such order of judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of any article, section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this ordinance.

Section 3. Repealer.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies only.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.





WHEREAS, J & C Custom Workroom LLC and/or 770 RAG Realty LLC are the taxpayers of real estate known as Block 6810, Lot 5, at 770 Route 17, Paramus, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the taxpayers filed tax appeals challenging the tax assessment for the tax years 2010, 2011 and 2012; and

WHEREAS, Block 6810, Lot 5 was assessed in the total amount of \$5,410,100 for the 2010, 2011, and 2012 tax years; and

WHEREAS, the taxpayers are seeking a reduction in the total assessment for Block 6810, Lot 5 for 2010, 2011, and 2012; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's Commercial Tax Appeal Attorney, Marc A. Raso, Esq. has engaged in discovery with respect to this matter and has consulted with the Borough's Appraiser, Robert McNerney, M.A.I. and Tax Assessor, James Anzevino, C.T.A., and has conducted extensive negotiations with counsel for the taxpayer; and

WHEREAS, the parties have been able to arrive upon a settlement agreement for Block 6810, Lot 5 whereby the 2010 tax appeal would have a revised assessment in the amount of \$3,750,000, the 2011 tax appeal would have a revised assessment in the amount of \$3,750,000, and the 2012 tax appeal would have a revised assessment in the amount of \$3,500,000; and

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed that prejudgment interest shall be waived as a condition of the settlement; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's Commercial Tax Appeal Attorney, Marc A. Raso, Esq., the Borough's Appraiser, Robert McNerney, M.A.I. and the Borough's Tax Assessor, James Anzevino, C.T.A. are in agreement with the terms of the settlement and believe that it would be in the best interest of the Borough to settle this particular case in accordance with the terms as set forth above;

WHEREAS, the Governor created the New Jersey Pension and Health Benefits Study Commission which released a report dated February 24, 2015; and

WHEREAS, this report recommends merging all nine (9) public employee pension funds in the State of New Jersey into one plan that would be merged into a new defined contribution plan (also known as a 457 plan); and

WHEREAS, local governments would have to pay an additional four (4) percent for each employee in the proposed new plan as well as fund a new pension liability for the two (2) local pension plans PERS and PFRS that would be frozen while current retirees receive their benefit; and

WHEREAS, the report also recommends that the State of New Jersey transfer the responsibility for teacher pension payments to the local school districts; and

WHEREAS, the report further recommends that the school districts absorb and make payment on an as yet undetermined portion of the over \$80,000,000 unfunded liability for the teachers' pension plan; and

WHEREAS, if these two (2) recommendations related to the Teacher's Pension Plan are enacted, it will mean an immediate property tax increase to cover these costs which are currently paid for by the State or are future funding obligations of the State; and

WHEREAS, of the nine (9) public employee pension plans in the State of New Jersey, the seven (7) established for State employees will become insolvent within six (6) to seventeen (17) years, and

WHEREAS, Standard & Poor's indicated that New Jersey's credit outlook will not improve until there has been significant and sustainable funding commitment to the state's pensions that, at a minimum, reverses the trend of growing liabilities; and

WHEREAS, there are two (2) pension plans that support local government employees, local PERS for municipal employees is solvent into perpetuity at current

funding levels, local PFRS for police officer and firefighters is fully funded for the next forty (40) years at current funding levels; and
