STAFF REPORT

Dr. Nazziola briefly reviewed the Health Officer's Report for February.

Nurses still collecting 'Go Red' money for the American Heart Association....

Still doing BP's, immunizations, counseling, school audit visits (857 records audited),
Handling of Long Term Care outbreaks, communicable disease investigations and referrals.

Coronavirus outbreak statistics are: 528 negatives, 891 positives.
Deaths from 2020 and 2021: Facilities 175, Communities 38, Closed 829.
Investigated – not on CDRSS: Positive 14 and 33 negative.

Gave 2 flu shots.

HEALTH EDUCATION

The Paramus Board of Health and the Mayors Wellness Campaign along with Valley Hospital, Gold's Gym and Shop-Rite of Paramus are sponsoring the "Ninth Annual Paramus Weight Loss Challenge" To date we have registered over 134 participants. 60 are active participants. The kick off will take place on January 18th by zoom. Meetings will be virtual weekly, and support Group meets every two weeks. Free fitness classes were offered through zoom.

ANIMAL CONTROL SERVICES

Total Calls 15 and animals handled 13.
5 Emergency calls and 2 pets returned to owners.

ENVIRONMENTAL REPORT

103 Food Establishments inspected: 103 and 29 spot checks.
Still receiving pool samples...
2 rabies bites investigated, 1 dog and 1 cat. None found positive.

Received 8 citizens complaints.
Several fire and emergency calls were dealt with at BJ's and Red Lobster where product was voluntarily destroyed.

Abatements given to establishments for no hot water and use of plastic bags.

For the Month of January our total Licenses & Permits came to \$86,250.00 and with Vital Statistics the grand total was \$90,732.00.

For February our Licensing & Permits totaled \$113,800.00 making the total year to date \$123,324.00.
